Students earn their B.A. in Biology from Benedictine and a certification, degree or licensure from one of our partner institutions. These partners include Hines Veterans Administration (VA), Northwestern Memorial Hospital and Rush University.

offers early decision acceptance opportunities to Benedictine pre-medical students who have completed their junior year and have met specified academic criteria.
